When the kingdom of Rehoboam was established and strong, he and all Israel with him forsook the law of the LORD. ²And it came about in King Rehoboam's fifth year, because they had been unfaithful to the LORD, that Shishak king of Egypt came up against Jerusalem ³ with 1,200 chariots and 60,000 horsemen.
