1. Get a bible you can **UNDERSTAND**.

"When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what has been sown in his heart. This is the one on whom seed was sown beside the road. Matthew 13:19 (NASB)

The grass withers, the flower fades, But the word of our God stands forever.

Isaiah 40:8 (NASB)

2. Look at the CONTEXT.

Some people say in order to understand the context of the scripture you need to read 20 verses before and 20 verses after and that a good rule to follow. But I would like to add that reading the intro to the book helps us to understand who wrote the book from where they wrote the book under what circumstance they wrote the book and to whom the book was written and the date it was written.
